ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to construct, validate and use a chemistry achievement test for the Senior Secondary two (SS 2) students in Akwa Ibom State. A pilot test was conducted, using an eighty item, multiple choice instrument. An item analysis of the test was carried out from which a forty item Validated Chemistry Achievement Test (VCAT) emerged. The VCAT had items with the discrimination index ranging from 0.27 to 0.63 and an average index of difficulty of 0.59. A reliability coefficient of 0.78 was obtained by the test retest procedure while 0.82 was the result of the split-half analysis. The instrument also had an internal consistency coefficient of 0.78. The walidated test was subsequently administered to, three hundred students from twelve schools in six Local Government Areas of Akwa Ibom State.

The study used a correlational cum comparative research design for which four hypotheses were generated. The first hypothesis, sught to uncover the relationship between the students' scores on the and their scores at their final SS 2 examination in Chemistry in of the participating schools. The other three hypotheses were to stablish the existing differences in scores among the students with ards to their sex, school location and teacher's qualification. The difference and the Z-score of significance of proportion were used to the different hypotheses where appropriate. All statistical

Results of data analysis showed that, the VCAT scores of students

SS 2 promotion examination scores, in Chemistry. This study also found that, boys in coeducational institutions performed significantly better than their female counterparts, while students in rural schools were found to achieve significantly better on the VCAT than students whose schools are situated in urban areas. Research results also revealed that, students taught by professionally unqualified teachers performed better on the VCAT than students taught by professionally trained teachers.

Based on the findings and conclusions reached in this study, it was recommended that, teachers should be instructed on the proper techniques of test construction through, seminars and workshops; more attention should be given to girls in coeducational institutions, in order to aid them achieve better in chemistry; and, a research be conducted to investigate into the poor performance recorded by students taught by professionally trained teachers; among others.
